



- 1 Canterbury Coast' - Scale is 9mm to 1ft (1/34). NZR prototype set in the 'black tarpaulin era'. Listen as steam trains rumble over the long bridge.
- 2 G (for garden) scale with HO San Miguel and Western on top. 3.5m x 2m.
- 3 'Brunner' - S scale (1/64) set in a historic West Coast location. Period is 1930s. Construction at an early stage.
- 4 A compact layout from Blenheim. Handmade diesels in a recognisable New Zealand setting. 1/120 scale.
- 5 Nostalgia! - The model railways granddad enjoyed. Clockwork, real steam, and electric. Memories.
- 6 'Tranz Alpine Railway' - Canterbury's own rugged Midland Line strikingly modelled in 1/120 scale.
- 7 An HO/OO scale layout comprising modules built by different individuals. Scenes reflect their builders' interests.
- 8 'Thomas the Tank Engine' - Drive this childhood favourite yourself for a small charge.
- 9 A large private HO/OO layout based on British Railways but with the opening of the channel tunnel showing some continental influences.
- 10 'Dormer' portable OO (1/76) layout. Typical British models and countryside.
- 11 So new that it has not yet been named, this N gauge layout features contrasting periods - a frontier bonanza mine and a modern intermodal yard.
- 12 'El Door-ra-do'. Modelling within the space limitations of a standard door. Built by a father and son team.
- 13 Coastal New England in the fishin', swimmin' and sailin', easy goin' 1940s. N gauge.
- 14 'Albula' - Impeccable HOe Swiss metre gauge mountain railway.
- 15 Bodenheim Yard. Rolling stock being correctly sorted for various destinations.
- 16 'Wrexton' - Readily available N gauge models combined to form a convincing scene in minimal space.
- 17 Farming and village life set among English countryside. N gauge (1/160).
- 18 TTn3 1/2 NZR (1/120) - Recognise scenes from coastal and Central Otago.
- 19 'Punga Junction' - What New Zealand in the early 1900s could have been like. HO (1/87) scale.
- 20 Track gauge is 16.5mm (HO). Scenery is typical New Zealand. Either American or NZ trains may be running.
- 21 A completely scenicked N gauge layout based on American practice.
- 22 An HO American layout depicting circus trains. Many working circus-related features. May be run by clowns?
- 23 Large G scale (1:22.5) railways most suitable for the garden. See how you can combine two popular hobbies!
- 24 Marklin (German HO). Mainline spirals over itself. Working crane.
- 25 A layout inspired by the famous Denniston Incline. Typical West Coast scenery.
- 26 Tiny Z scale on a coffee table.
- 27 German HO set in pre-WWII period, mid-way through nationalisation. Emphasis is on shunting.
